Board of Directors Monthly Meeting

The following members were present: Tom Jeffers, Dale Oliver, Carl McDaniels, Joyce Martin, R.B. "Ben" Crawford, Jim Moore, Mary Ellen Moore, Glen Mitchell, Jim Gaines, Frank Lau, Doris Abraham, Darrell Clowes, June Schmidt, Harriet Damant and Harriett Cooper. Those not in attendance: Jane Lane. Carl McDaniel, President called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM. The agenda was approved followed by approval of the minutes.

A visitor to the Board was Katherine Malone, who could not come. She is a VA Tech Student active in the Service Learning Program and needs to meet her commitment of 30 hours of service. Joyce Martin felt she could help with membership contacts and other telephone calls. Other suggestions were to use her help during Blacksburg AARP meetings if Ms. Malone's class schedule does not conflict.

The treasurers report was given by Joyce Martin, Treasurer Brian Allen, Treasurer, is away due to family illness. The ending balance in January was \$2, 208.34. Income for February was \$480.00 less expenses of \$150, leaving a balance of \$ 248.34. Jim Moore volunteered to help with the treasurers duties to relieve Brian Allen as needed.

Joyce Martin, Membership Chair., reported the current paid membership has increased to 199. The membership Committee has made reminder calls to those not listed as paid. Joyce also reported that a new Post Office Box at the University Mall Post Office has been secured for the Blacksburg Chapter.

Program Committee Chair Ben Crawford reported that programs for March, April and May were complete and that the June Picnic is scheduled. Details will be in the newsletter. Since some of the future meetings are combined with other organizations, Doris Abraham suggested the Board look into booking a larger room for these occasions. President McDaniels would work to do this.

Frank Lau and Darrell Clowes continue to work on Newsletter Design. They encouraged members with reports to make deadlines and to send them items that may be of interest to all members, including ideas for health care and healthful living. (FYI would be its place in the newsletter)

Carl McDaniels shared copies of an article from a recent The Roanoke Times Current regarding the new **Blacksburg AARP Chapter Website** designed and managed by member Connie Anderson. The use of pictures on the Website was discussed.

Chapter Plans for the future include a Red Cross Blood Mobile to be held at Blacksburg Recreation Center, cosponsored by AARP and The Town of Blacksburg. It was suggested the date be scheduled after the AARP Fall Health Fair. Jim Moore, Committee Chair, stated he would try for an October date. A general discussion was held regarding the cut off date for membership. June Schmidt and Doris Abraham reminded the board that the deadline for having your name printed in the member list is April 30th. This was accepted as a deadline and so no motion was required.

June Schmidt reported that the Volunteer Recognition Program is scheduled for April 9, 2005 and that adequate funding has been received with help from the Montgomery Regional Hospital and other sources. It is anticipated that about 15 persons will be recognized at the program.

AARP Virginia items of interest: Carl McDaniels gave a brief report on the AARP Policy regarding Long Term Care and reported that May 12th is the National Day of Service and the plans for a cooperative program of Home Modification with Habitat For Humanity

are evolving. The details and funding are to be approved by AARP Virginia.

R.B."Ben" Crawford was invited to attend a meeting at the **Governor's Mansion** where among other things was a discussion regarding the Senior Olympic Games. Ben presented a motion to the Board that the Board approve \$100.00 to cosponsor the NRV Senior Olympics-Games with the Montgomery Parks and Recreation Department. Passed unanimously.

Glen Mitchell, Legislative Chair, presented a report with copies to each board member stating the current AARP nonpartisan views regarding the Social Security issues. Following the report and discussion Glen asked

what role does the Board and/or Blacksburg AARP Chapter want to play with this issue? Ben Crawford presented a motion seconded by Jim Moore that the .Legislative Committee draft a letter to Congress Members on behalf of the Board that would address the non partisan issues on Social Security expressed and supported by the board. This motion passed unanimously.

In final business the Board approved by Consensus to give out, at the membership meeting, copies of a flyer regarding a **Community Strength Pledge Certificate**. Background information will be presented at the membership meeting. Meeting adjourned at 11:00 AM


AARP/Town Bloodmobile

The AARP and the Blacksburg recreation center are sponsoring a bloodmobile in October. Think seriously about donating. Only 4% of the people who are eligible to donate do donate. Over 90% of families in the U. S. will need blood. Your family may be one of these.

"Older people can't donate". Oh yes they can! There is no age limit to donating. I know an 81 year old who has donated 65 pints and is still donates every 8 weeks. However, some older persons have medical conditions that disqualify them. If this is your case, a nurse at your entry interview will excuse you and not send you on. If you or someone in your family needs blood, you will quickly agree that: "Your old tired blood is as welcome as young blood in an emergency!"
