Our Delegates *Jim Shuler* and *Dave Nutter* will bring us up to date on recent work of the Virginia Legislature and status of major and difficult items like transportation. How to increase safety on overcrowded I-81, provide more options for freight and passenger travel, repair our deteriorating roads, and how to pay for these are all important questions yet to be answered. LEGISLATIVE REPORT

Blacksburg AARP participated in a meeting with candidates for Blacksburg mayor and town council held at the Old Blacksburg Middle School on April 22, organized by three local citizens. Other groups participating were the Virginia Interfaith Coalition, the NAACP and the Downtown Merchants.

The meeting format allowed each candidate to meet individually for 12 minutes with each of the four groups. Questions raised by AARP members resulted from an earlier meeting between local AARP members and town and county planners. These dealt with the need of "accessible housing for seniors" including some low income housing, how to provide better transportation for seniors who can't drive but don't qualify as being "handicapped," and how to bring a geriatric care physician to Blacksburg.

Several candidates cited housing projects on Lee St. for lower income citizens as one project to meet this need and mentioned the possibility of converting part of old Blacksburg Middle School into senior housing. Some members commented that downtown housing would also require a downtown grocery and drug store to serve residents of such a facility. candidates also proposed that the town have a small bus or van to transport seniors on some form of a schedule. One common theme that reoccurred the need for better was

communication between the town and county on several issues. The need for a larger facility to serve seniors as the Blacksburg population ages was also raised.



Board of Directors Monthly Meeting Blacksburg Community Center Tuesday, May 2, 2006

- 1. President McDaniels called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. Jim Gaines gave an update on the progress that has been made since the Martin's fire. He stated that AARP members, along with VA Tech service learning students, tilled, raked and seeded the Martin's yard on April 15. McDaniels announced that the first effort to clean-up the Blacksburg park will be today immediately after the meeting.
- 2. Jim Moore requested to add the Ways and Means Committee to the agenda.
- 3. The Board unanimously approved the April 2006 minutes as printed.



- **4. Treasurer,** Brian Allen, reported that there is a current balance of \$3,343.26. \$30 has been made from the sale of the Jamestowne books.
- **5.** McDaniels stated that \$100 was given to support/cosponsor the **NRV Senior Olympic Games** that began yesterday.
- **6.** McDaniels reported for the **Public Relations Committee** in the Eiss' absence. The station manager of 810 AM, Dominic Andrews, has requested that the AARP Chapter host a series of call-in radio shows from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Saturday mornings. Suggestions for programs included: legislation, history, leisure activities, driver safety, tax aide, music, etc. Jim Gaines made a motion for the Blacksburg AARP Chapter to enter into a partnership with the 810 AM radio station and to assign the Public Relations Committee to explore doing a one-hour call-in show with them. Don Elson seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Crawford suggested that they meet with Tony Hylton, state AARP Associate Director and media expert, for ideas.
- 7. Jim Wightman distributed a written Membership Committee report to the board showing that the membership currently stands at 373. 83 members have not yet paid their 2006 dues. It was decided that reminder phone calls would be made. A September Newsletter will be mailed to Virginia Tech retirees who are not members of the local chapter, inviting them to join. The question was raised as to how you become a lifetime member of national AARP. McDaniels will contact AARP to find out. It was suggested that a special letter of invitation to non-chapter members in our zip code region be mailed, but AARP will not release their mailing list. Crawford stated that AARP could send a letter at no charge to us. McDaniels thanked Wightman for his hard work of chairing the Membership Committee and recruiting members.
- **8.** McDaniels reported on the **Program Committee** in Harriett Cooper's absence. Delegates Shuler and Nutter will be the presenters at the May 16 meeting with the Free Clinic addressing the members as well. Cerrie Coil reported that the plans for the June 20 picnic and the **30th anniversary celebration** are in place. Wayne Garst will be the auctioneer for the White Elephant Sale. The Health and Wellness Fair is scheduled for September 19. Jim Moore made a motion to postpone the presently planned fair to partner with a program being sponsored by the VA Tech Retiree Association in October or November. This program will be addressing issues and resources that families of disabled and physically-challenged individuals need, and would have a different theme than health fairs held in the past. Don Elson seconded, discussion followed and the motion did not pass. Jo Ann Underwood, chair of the fair stated that she is looking for ways to put a positive outlook in the fair with the use of clowns, humor and speakers. McDaniels appointed Curt Finch to assist Jo Ann in the planning of the fair.
- **9.** Ben Crawford stated that the deadline for all **newsletter** articles is Friday, May 5.
- **10. AARP Virginia Events:** April 20 "Smart Choices" Workshops Blacksburg, Custom Catering with 125 attending; Saturday, May 13 Day of Service at the Bowyer Family's home from 9-1, with the rain date as May 20. Tim Lawrence will be coordinating the work project.
- 11. McDaniels recognized Frank Lau as running for Blacksburg Town Council as well as Wendell Hensley, both AARP members. Dominic Andrews and Danny Ratliff from 810 AM came into the meeting to introduce themselves to the Board and explain the goal of the morning call-in show.
- **12.** Dan Fleming, **Legislative Co-chair**, reported that they have moved up the dates that Medicare and Social Security are going to go bankrupt to 2018 and 2040, respectively. A meeting will be held tomorrow with Warm Hearth Village who will be paying for the printing of 500 copies of the Chapter **history.**
- **13.** Margaret Kates of the **Ways and Means Committee** reported on the sale of the Jamestowne books and it was decided to present Delegates Nutter and Shuler with one each at the May meeting. Jim Moore reported that he has contacted 33 state chapters by e-mail asking for ideas for fundraising. He received 11 returns, with drawings being the main activity reported by the majority.
- **14.** The meeting was **adjourned** at 11:08 a.m.
