AARP National Day of Service, Thursday May 12, 2005

Our Blacksburg AARP Chapter has been invited to be one of 10 Chapters in Virginia to be part of a state-wide home modification effort for low income seniors living in their own house. The emphasis will be on helping a senior family to remain safely in their own home rather than vacate for some type of long term care facility. The Home Depot Corporation has agreed to support this AARP effort with direct help at the local store level. This means in our area the Christiansburg Home Depot store will provide a Team Leader and several skilled staff members to work along side Blacksburg AARP volunteers and our other local partner, New River Valley Habitat For Humanity.

In mid-April the three local partners will meet to workout a plan of action, then visit the home selected for modification and develop an on site assessment approach which will suit all parties. This is an unusual opportunity for our chapter members to get involved with some very direct community service. Among their current volunteer activities, Mary Ellen is providing a meal, transportation, and games twice a month for 12 mentally handicapped persons, while Jim is extensively involved in Virginia Tech and Red Cross disaster planning efforts.
