Below is a reprint of the Board's request.

You will notice from the minutes of the last board meeting that your directors voted unanimously to help the Senior Center obtain some much needed items for the facility, as a charitable project for our members as well as a thank you for allowing us to meet at the center and use the facilities at no charge; we also have our board meetings there. We are asking your help in raising enough money to cover most items on their list. They need a wheelchair (\$1,200), some sets of dumbbell weights (\$135), resistance bands (\$75 a box), 10 exercise mats (\$50 each), and 2 convertible cane stools (\$25 each). I haven't totaled these up but you can see what we are trying to achieve.


