# AARP Blacksburg Chapter Minutes

June 1, 2020

President Don Creamer opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. Minutes of May 5, 2020 board meeting were approved.

# **Treasurer Report:**

- Pat Ballard reports that she re-issued check to Warm Hearth for Christmas (original check was lost by recipient.)
- Two membership checks arrived for new members.
- Received form to re-register with State Commission.

# **Monthly Programs Options:**

- Judith Jones reports that speakers are scheduled to present online via Zoom for Chapter through December 2020.
- Curt Laub will be the first online speaker on June 16, 2020. His presentation is titled: "Bugs and Us: Insects and Our Culture"
- Additional scheduled online presentations will take place in June, July, September, October and December 2020.
- November program is the Veteran's program.

#### **Annual Picnic Plans:**

- Tentative date/time for Annual Picnic is August 4, 2020 from 5:00 p.m. 7:30 p.m. at Terry's farm.
- Don Creamer will poll chapter members to gauge their interest in attending a picnic this year during COVID.
- It was noted that AARP Virginia has strict orders to NOT allow any type of in-person meeting at this time, per Brian Jacks. This AARP order is currently set to expire on July 1, 2020.
- Per Ben Crawford AARP Giles county is offering a car-side social. Their chapter provides lunch, but members stay in car and wear a mask. Ben will provide feedback regarding the success of this style of gathering.

#### **Care Committee:**

• Leslie Pendleton reports that the Community Challenge Grant Proposal is being reworked to focus on virtual events because of COVID restrictions on public gatherings.

#### Updated initiative covers three areas:

- 1. **Virtual Engagement** (Veteran's profiles, story-telling and photography; bluegrass virtual concerts partner with the Floyd Country Store; drive-in movie Starlight Drive-in Movie with goody-bags, provide cost of admission and food/drink package)
- 2. Access to Food and Necessities (Vittles for Vets donations of gift cards; Lending Library book box in front of VFW building)
- 3. Access to Services and Economic Activities (Marketing Materials for Veterans Resource Fair for November; Mary Lou Summers for the Veteran's Cemetery to purchase wreaths for December wreath laying \$2795 budget) Community Challenge Grant to be matched by State

Response to Community Challenge Grant application is expected by the end of June 2020.

- Discussed idea of Care Committee initiative to establish a call campaign to "check-in" with our chapter members.
- Decided that too many scam calls prevent many members from answering.
- Chapter will communicate frequently with members, but we will not have a special "call brigade" by the Care Committee.

# **Additional Community Challenge Grant:**

- Wendy Baldwin is exploring Challenge Grant opportunity to enhance Senior Access to Downtown Blacksburg.
- Proposing installation of 10 benches in downtown Blacksburg for Seniors.
- Cost estimate is \$11,000 for 10 benches.
- Response to Community Challenge Grant application is expected by the end of June 2020.

# **Spring Celebration for Seniors:**

- Wendy Baldwin is exploring idea of organizing an event "Spring Celebration for Seniors" to be held at the Community Center to celebrate ageing in 2021.
- Event will have exhibitors, art displays, story-telling and demonstrations for seniors.
- The Month of May is "Older Americans Month"
- Don Creamer asked Wendy to consider fund raising activities during this event.
- Wendy will proceed with exploration, planning and report progress to chapter board.

#### Give Local NRV 2020:

- Request for continued \$500 sponsorship contribution was made.
- Board agreed to continue support of "Give Local NRV 2020"
- The cost will be split between AARP Blacksburg Chapter and LLI funds.

#### **LLI Update:**

- LLI is transitioning to online courses and events for Fall 2020.
- Recruited 22 volunteers to be virtual assistants to support members and instructors.
- 26 online courses planned at this time.

#### **Newsletter:**

• Carolyn Rude reports that early September/October Newsletter is next scheduled issue.

# **State and Chapter Awards:**

- Chuck Burress reported status of current State and Chapter Award proposals.
- Andrus Award nominee is Jerry Niles for his successful and tireless work to "improve the quality of life for seniors in our community"
- Carolyn Rude will draft the nomination document with Don Creamer and Pat Hyer.
- Deadline for nomination is July 1, 2020.

# **Leadership Development:**

- Jerry Niles reports that leadership development activities have been interrupted by COVID.
- He has experienced difficulty recruiting new members and developing new leadership during lock-down.
- Jerry requested help from board members to identify people with talents and interest to serve through our AARP Chapter.
- Open positions include new Board Members, Secretary and Vice President of AARP Chapter.

# **Legislative Update:**

Doug Feuerbach reports that there has been no news on Rx cost control. Current focus is on COVID.

# **Leadership Development:**

- Leslie Pendleton suggested that chapter develops a training program for leadership positions.

# **AARP Liaison Report:**

- Ben Crawford reports that Virginia has a new AARP State President, Joyce Williams from Roanoke area.
- "Joyce brings to this position decades of experience in service and leadership. She spent
  her career as an educator, including time as a teacher, assistant principal, and ultimately
  principal. Since retiring, Joyce has been an active volunteer with AARP Virginia both as
  a member of the Roanoke Area AARP Leadership Team and as an officer of Southwest
  Roanoke AARP Chapter #4652. More recently, she served as AARP Virginia's Southwest
  Bureau Chief of the Virtual Volunteer Newsroom."

# **Gerrymandering Update:**

- Ben Crawford reports that the General Assembly passed the proposed constitutional amendment bill for the second time in January.
- Citizens need to approve the amendment in November.
- Chapter plans to encourage our members to vote YES on this amendment in November election, and will send MailChimp message regarding this topic.
- Pat Hyer urged that directions for obtaining an absentee ballot for November election be featured in the newsletter and email at appropriate times.

# Pat Hyer Resignation:

- Pressing priorities of LLI responsibilities and Community Foundation obligations requires Pat to discontinue chapter Secretarial activities at this time.
- Lisa Moose will cover Secretarial functions for chapter during Don Creamer's Presidency in 2020.
